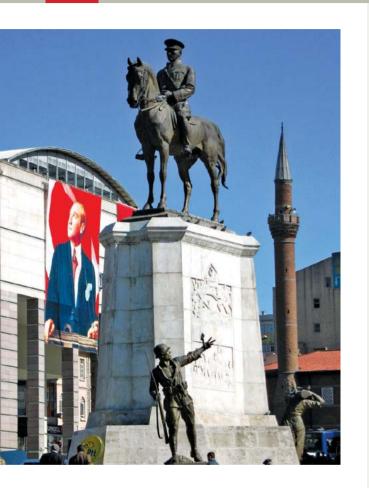

1. ANKARA, THE CAPITAL





Turkey's **2ND** Biggest City Europe's **Biggest** Capital

The capital city of the Republic of Turkey, Ankara houses all important public institutions, 98 embassies, and the central and regional offices of international organisations (such as UN and the World Bank). In addition to large scale construction and energy organisations, strategic organisations in tourism, defence, telecommunication, informatics and logistics fields provide attractive business opportunities to investors.

2. ANKARA, HEART OF TURKEY



Ankara is the capital city of Turkish Republic, centre of its region, and the 2nd biggest city of Turkey and Europe regarding population. It is "the heart of Turkey" concerning both its location and its function. With its history going back to thousands of years, Ankara housed many different civilisations and empires. In our day, it is possible to see the traces of this rich history that extends from Hittites to Phrygians, from Romans to Seljuks, and from Ottoman Empire to becoming the capital of Turkish Republic.

Located at a geography between the branches of Kızılırmak and Sakarya rivers, Ankara has an total acreage of 25,437 km2 and a population of 4,890,893 people living at its 25 districts. In the region that has an acreage of 2,516 km2, average temperatures range from 25 °C in the summer months to 5 °C in the winter months.

With a dense concentration of universities, technoparks, industrial zones, strong sector clusters, high level bureaucracy, international institutions and non-governmental organisations, the capital city of Ankara is on its way to becoming a global city with its rich economical, social, human and intellectual capital.

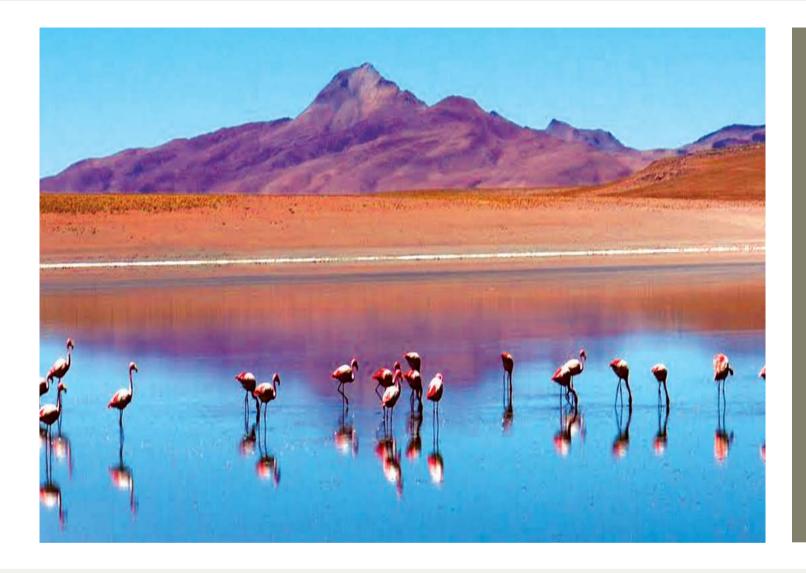

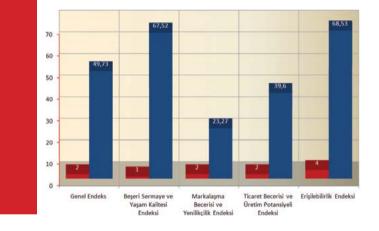

Ankara ranked at second place in the list of most competitive provinces of Turkey according to the "Interprovincial Competitiveness Index" study conducted by International Competitiveness Research Institute (URAK) within 2009 – 2010 period; and at first place in the study of "A Competiveness Index for Turkey" conducted by the Centre for Economic and Foreign Policy Studies (EDAM) in year 2010.

Especially in human and social capital, creative capital and life quality fields, Ankara resides at the top ranks indisputably in all studies.

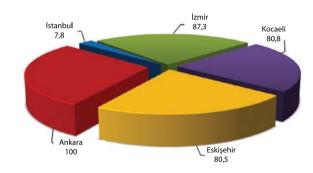

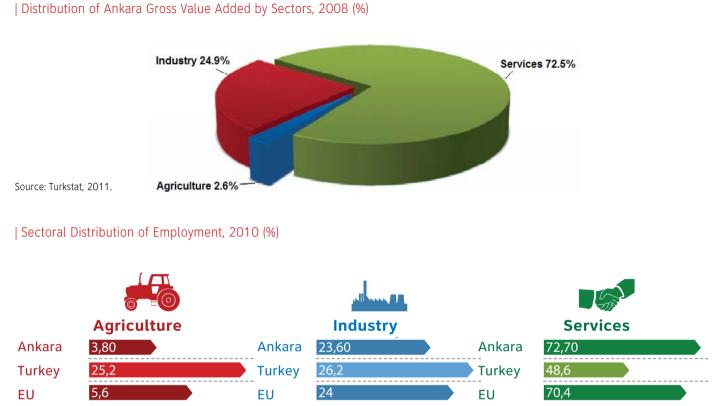


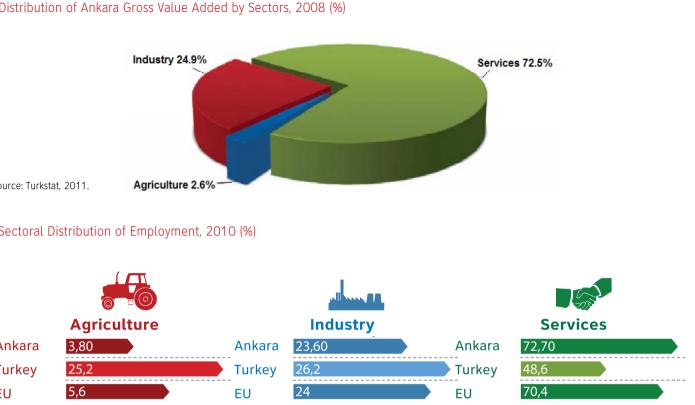
5. ANKARA, KEY INDUSTRIES



- » Ankara is the 2nd largest economy of the country with a GVA of \$57 billion.
- » Generates a GVA per capita of \$12,598.
- » The 3rd biggest importer and 5th biggest exporter of Turkey.
- » Has a foreign trade volume of \$24.7 billion.
- » Houses 11 organised industrial zones and 6 technoparks that provide many tax advantage and various other incentives.
- » Is a city of high international competitivness with its strong Defence and Aviation Industry, Medical Industry, Renewable Energy, Work and Construction Machinery clusters.

The fact that services sector has a high share of 72.5% highlights that Ankara becomes prominent with services just like other European capitals. This sector, in which especially health, education, banking and finance, tourism, construction and senior bureaucracy are concentrated, is the leader regarding employment and GVA.



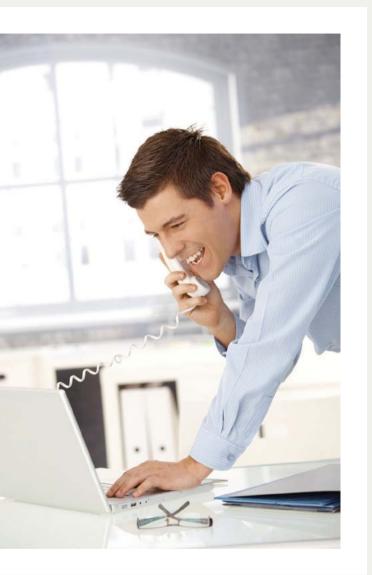

Ankara is leader in Turkey, competitive at international arena, and a base for sectors such as Informatics, Defence Industry and Healthcare Technologies. By means of OIZs, Technology Development Zones, Clusters and qualified universities supporting the industrial infrastructure, Ankara industry opens up to the world market wth high added value products.







AN ANKARA CLASSIC

Science and technology infrastructure, human capital, and genuine cultural assets of Ankara have both national and international scale competitiveness. The city is a centre of attraction that draws qualified people both local and abroad to itself for education and employment purposes.

- » Over 15% of the population has high school or higher education level.
- » Has more than 200,000 university students and 18,000 lecturers.
- » Produces an annual total of 50,000 university and other higher education institution graduates.
- » Employs a total labour force of 1.6 million, of which 5,900 is in R&D, 18,000 in academy, 341,000 in industry and 1,050,000 in services sector.

EDUCATION IN ANKARA

With its educated population, recognised universities, research centres and quality publications, Ankara is not only the most prominent city of Turkey in this regard but is also above the averages of developed countries. The abundance of research and advanced research centres in Ankara attracts particular attention.

- » With a secondary-and-higher education graduate ratio of 29%, the province is at first place throughout Turkey and is over the EU-27 average of 22.7%.
- » With schooling ratios of 99.94% in elementary education, 48.77% in general secondary education, and 24.01% in vocational and technical secondary education, the province is over Turkey overall averages.
- » An expert human resource resides in Ankara, particularly in public sector. 25% of all professors, 21% of associate professors, and 18.5% of overall lecturers are employed in Ankara.
- » As of the education period covering years 2009-2010, there are 162,132 students at associate and undergraduate degrees, producing 28,124 graduates and receiving 40,279 new registrations per year.

R&D BELONGS TO ANKARA

Ankara has a strong infrastructure both in R&D and innovation and in informatics fields. Standing out with the high number of technoparks and private sector R&D centres, Ankara is the leader in this field with R&D supports received from various institutions. Housing 6 out of 39 technoparks in Turkey, it is also the city with the most technoparks in the country.

✓ WITH ITS 6 TECHNOPARKS, ANKARA IS AT FIRST PLACE IN THIS REGARD

» The oldest one and the one housing the highest number of companies among technoparks is METU Technopolis that was established in year 2001 housing more than 250 companies, and the one that has the largest acreage is Hacettepe Technopolis with an area of over 2000 decares.

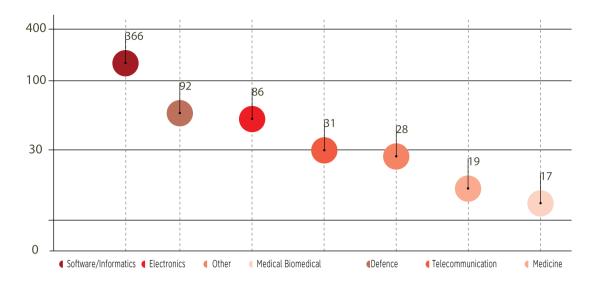

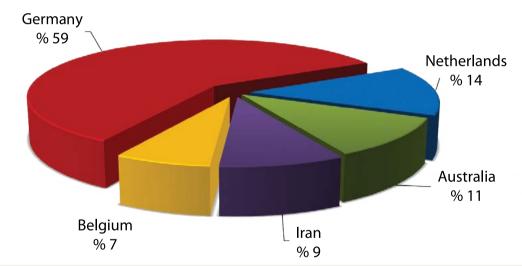

| Top 5 Countries By Distribution Of Foreigners Visiting Ankara In 2009



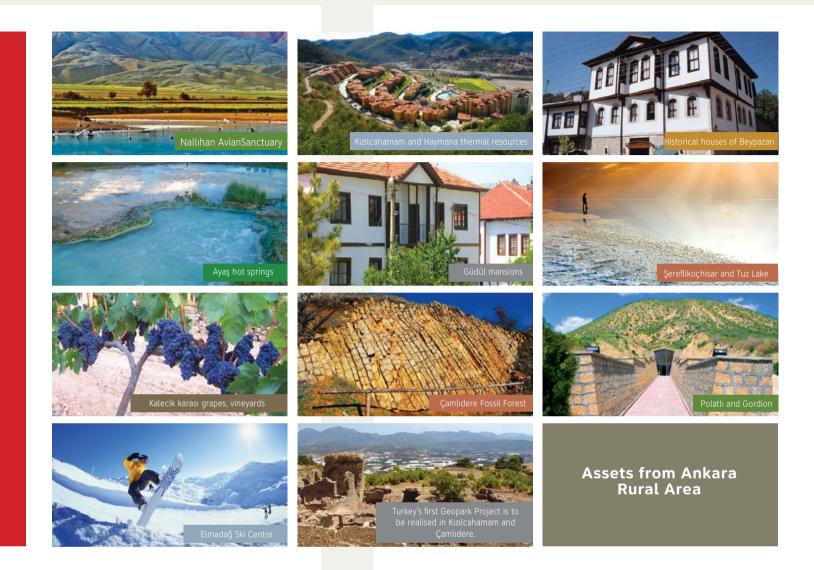

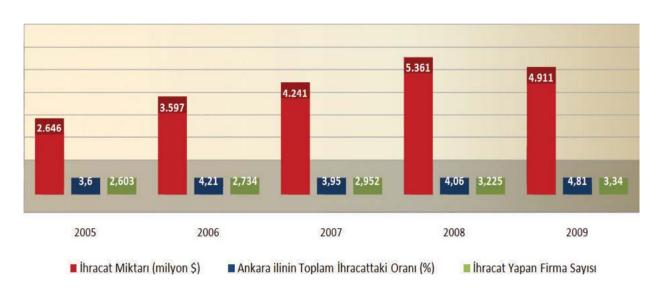

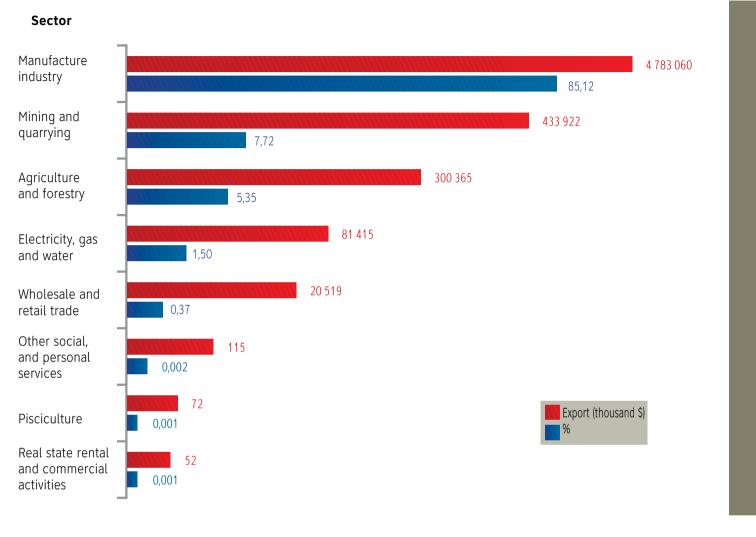

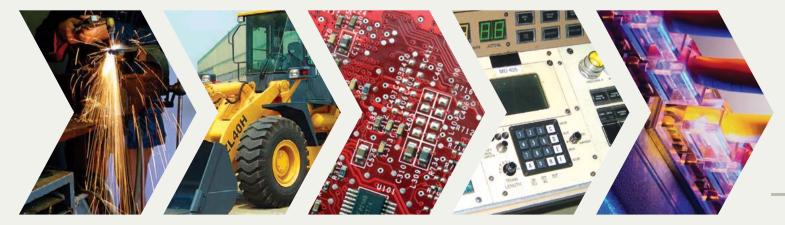

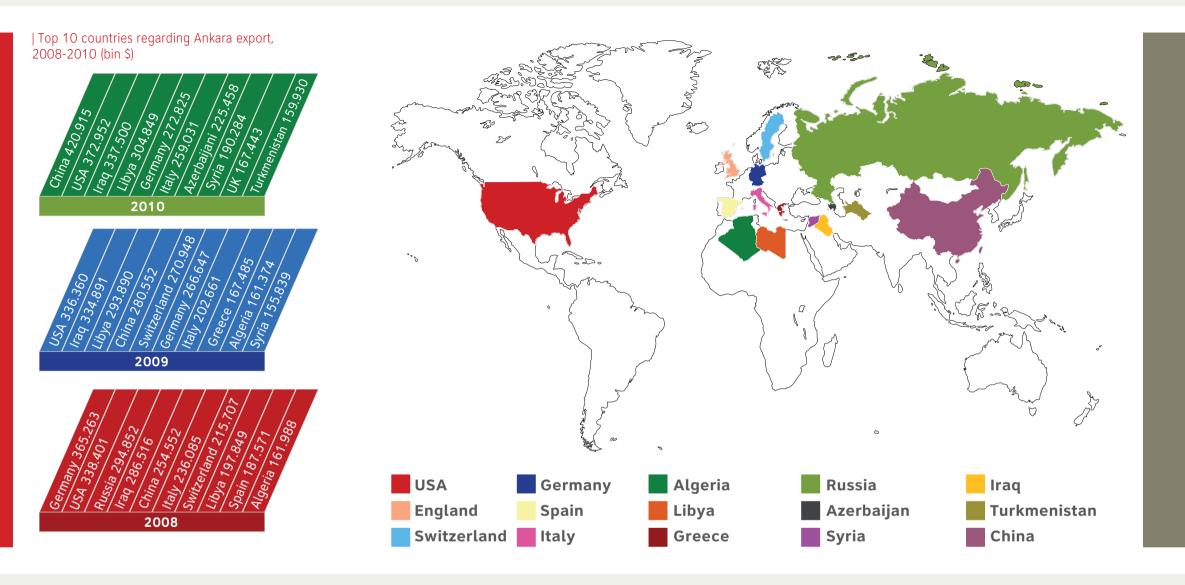

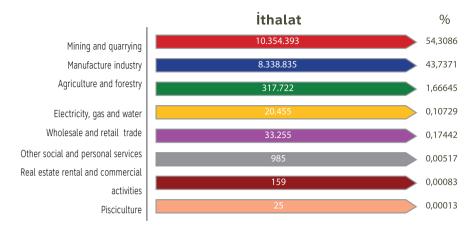

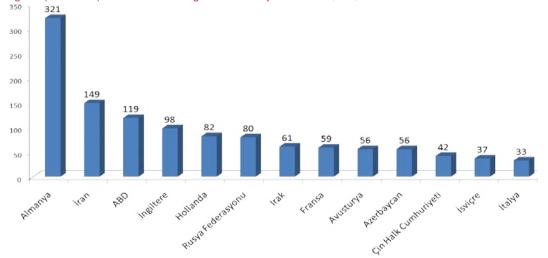


| Sectoral Distribution of Import, 2010 (%)

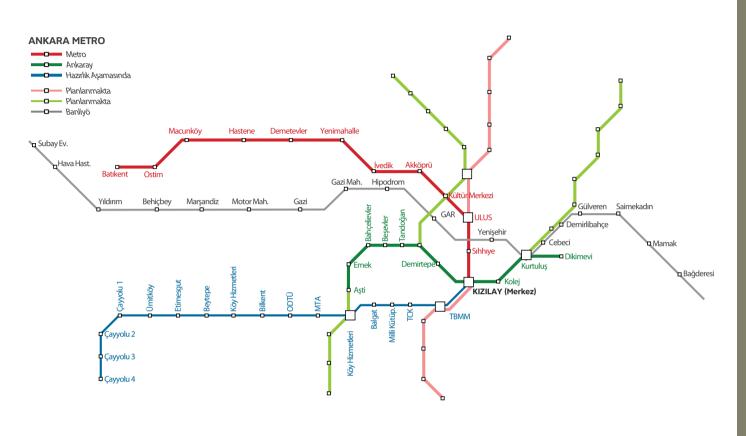
